



# Enhanced Engineering

Launch into an Engineering Apprenticeship with enhanced knowledge and skills with this PAID Traineeship Program.

## Program Overview:

This program is PAID (in accordance with trainee award wages). Participants will be required to commit to full-time 38 hours, five (5) days per week, over 13-weeks, for training and work placement and includes:

- 10-weeks of training to obtain a Certificate I in Engineering.
- Teaching elements from 9 accredited units determined as highly desirable by industry:
  - Develop a career plan for the engineering and manufacturing industry
  - Undertake a basic engineering project
  - Participate in environmentally sustainable work practices
  - Interact with computing technology
  - Use engineering workshop machines
  - Use electric welding machines
  - Use oxy-acetylene and soldiering equipment
  - Use fabrication equipment
  - Pull apart and reassemble engineering mechanisms.
  - Fusion Welding Proficiency ISO 9606.
- Industry engagement and additional training in Situational Safety Awareness, Wellness and Self-Care, Industrial Relations and Workplace Preparation.
- 3-weeks work placement with an Engineering / Manufacturing host business.
- Support throughout program to help participants progress and transition into an apprenticeship (subject to availability).
